Nemours Debuts *Just Dance!* Adaptive Dance and Movement Program

Wilmington, DE – Nemours Children's Health System recently launched the *Just Dance!* adaptive dance and movement program, in partnership with the Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts in Philadelphia, PA. Held over six Saturday morning classes, *Just Dance!* is designed to create access to dance in a safe space for children with diverse needs.

The free program focuses on seeing dance through different lenses--as made up of movement, action, space, energy and time. Dancers will explore different activities that highlight these themes, all while seeking to understand what "dance" means to them. The experienced dance instructors will create adaptations and supports for each dancer, so they can all participate and help redefine what is traditionally thought of as dance.

To celebrate the children's dance exploration, a recital will be performed for their loved ones and greater community.

Key Facts

- *Just Dance!* will take place on Saturdays from March 23rd through April 27th.
- Classes will take place at the Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts, 300 South Broad Street, Philadelphia, PA 19102
- The recital, which is open to the community, will be on April 28th.
- There are two age groups: Ages 5-7 and 8-10.
- No previous dance experience is necessary and parents are welcome to participate.
- The entire program, including recital costumes, is free to all.
